## The start of EAPA

During the 'Conference on the Structural Design of Asphalt Pavements' held in London in 1972, representatives of different national European asphalt associations met and decided to organise a European meeting.


The first meeting was held on the 9<sup>th</sup> of March 1973 in Munich and here the representatives of the national associations started to prepare the actions needed to create a European Association. Representatives of Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland and the UK were present. After that, a Preparatory Committee was created to make the preparations and organise meetings to take a formal decision on the 14<sup>th</sup> of October 1973 for founding EAPA. The secretary of this Committee was W.G. Josch, the director of the German Asphalt Association (VTA).

On this day, representatives of Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Great Britain, the Netherlands, Norway, Spain and Sweden met and founded the European Asphalt Pavement Association. Since Switzerland had no official national association, it was present as a guest. There were also representatives from North America and South Africa.

### The goals of EAPA as defined in 1973

To have an intensive exchange of information between the member countries regarding the production of asphalt in the construction phase, as well as, in the maintenance phase, the quality requirements and the environmental aspects, aiming to develop collaboration structures with various authorities to support the interests of the asphalt industry and improve the process of developing European opinions based on technical, social, welfare and environmental aspects.

Furthermore, to organise international EAPA congresses.
